

PE funding Impact Statement 2019-20.

The Government is providing additional funding to improve the provision of PE and sport in primary schools. This funding is provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and is ring-fenced; therefore, can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools, but schools have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Objectives of spending PPSG:

- ☆ To improve the provision of PE at Great Rollright C of E Primary School
- ☆ Broaden the sporting opportunities and experiences available to pupils
- ☆ To develop a love of sport and physical activity
- ☆ To offer cross age and cross curricular opportunities
